# **Exercise 1: Describe and Guess**

- 4. How do you think they are feeling? Why?
- 5. What could be inside their suitcase?

Example answer: "They must be a family waiting for something important. Maybe they are emigrants who have left their home behind."

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# **Expressing Hypothesis and Supposition in English (B2 Level)**

# 1. Modal Verbs for Hypothesis

- Might / May / Could → To express possibility.
  - The family in the painting might be waiting for a train.
  - o It could be that they have been abandoned in the city.
- **Must**  $\rightarrow$  To express a strong assumption.
  - o They must be feeling lost and anxious.
- Can't / Couldn't → To express a strong impossibility.
  - o This can't be a happy moment for them.

#### 2. Conditional Sentences for Hypothesis

- **Second Conditional** (hypothetical situations in the present/future)
  - o If they had a home to return to, they wouldn't be standing there with their suitcase.
- Third Conditional (hypothetical situations in the past)
  - o If they had left earlier, they might have caught the last bus.

### 3. Other Useful Expressions

- I suppose / I imagine / I guess
  - o I imagine they are waiting for someone to pick them up.
- It seems / It looks like
  - o It seems that they are in a deserted part of the city.
- It is likely / unlikely that...
  - o It is unlikely that they know exactly what will happen next.
- There is a chance that...
  - o There is a chance that they are immigrants arriving in a new country.
- They appear to be...
  - o They appear to be exhausted from a long journey.
